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INTRODUCTION

This Guide describes in detail how athletes and teams can qualify for the Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Asian Para Games in each of the 18 sports on the Games programme. It provides to the National Paralympic Committees (NPCs), to National Sport Federations, to sports administrators, coaches and to the athletes themselves the conditions that allow participation in the most important Para Sport event exclusively for the Asian Region.

The Guide presents:

- An overview of the Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Asian Para Games Sports Programme.
- The general Asian Paralympic Committee (APC) regulations on eligibility.
- The specific qualification criteria for each sport (in alphabetical order).

Structure of Sport-Specific Qualification Criteria

QUALIFICATION METHODS

There are a variety of qualification methods which the International Federations/Asian Federations (IFs/AFs) may employ depending on the nature and practices of each sport. The mixture of qualification methods within each sport is supposed to respect the following principles:

- To ensure that Asia's leading athletes receive the opportunity to perform at the highest level.
- To uphold the fundamental ethical concept of non-discrimination.
- To ensure that regional opportunities for qualification exist (wherever possible) and that regional distribution of qualification slots is justifiably based on elite performance and/or prevalence of a sport in each sub-region.

The following qualification methods may be used:

- Placement at World Championships
- Placement at Regional/Zonal Championships or Regional Games
- Placement in other IF/AF sanctioned Competitions or Qualifiers
- Rank on a World or Regional Ranking List
- Rank on a specific Asian Qualification Ranking List
- Achievement of a Minimum Qualification Standard (MQS) with or without subsequent Quota Allocation Formula
- Host Country Slots
- Bipartite Invitations

Official Language

The official language of the Asian Paralympic Committee is English. If an NPC translates this document for internal purposes the English version shall prevail in case of discrepancy.

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AICHI-NAGOYA 2026 ASIAN PARA GAMES SPORTS PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Asian Para Games represents a Regional, multi-sport competition for athletes with a physical, visual, or intellectual impairment that reflects the highest standards of athletic excellence and diversity in the Asia Region. The goal of the Asian Para Games Sports Program is to provide exciting and inspiring events in the Asian Para Games that allow athletes to achieve competitive excellence while engaging and entertaining spectators.

General APC Regulations on Eligibility

In addition to each International Federation's/Asian Federation's athlete eligibility criteria, the APC has established a set of general conditions that apply to all participants in the Asian Para Games. These general regulations are derived from the APC Handbook. They ensure that the fundamental rights and obligations of the APC and its membership are recognized and protected. The General APC Regulations on Eligibility are as follows:

- APC Membership
- Compliance with APC Athletes Nationality Code
- Minimum Age Requirement
- Understanding and Agreeing to the IPC Eligibility Code
- NPC Selection Standards
- Compliance with the Classification Rules

APC Membership

Only NPCs in good standing with the APC by 18 October 2026 may enter duly qualified and eligible athletes in the Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Asian Para Games. NPCs are reminded that athletes must ensure their membership with their sport's respective International Federation or Asian Federation (only if necessary) including the IPC is in good standing during the qualification period and upon close of entry to the Asian Para Games.

Compliance with APC Athletes Nationality Code

Any athlete in the Asian Para Games must be a national of the country/territory of the NPC entering him/her and in compliance with the provisions of the Nationality Code as published in the APC Handbook.

Minimum Age Requirement

No minimum age limit for athletes competing in the Asian Para Games is stipulated by the APC on a general basis. However, NPCs should note that an age limit may be established by relevant International Federations/Asian Federations through sport-specific athlete eligibility standards. While the Asian Para Games welcomes Asia's youth with impairment, NPCs are asked to use discretion and send to the Games only athletes adequately prepared for high performance competition.

Understanding and Agreeing to the Eligibility Code

To be eligible for participation in the Asian Para Games, all athletes must sign, observe, comply with and abide by the rules and regulations outlined on the IPC Eligibility Code form. The IPC Eligibility Code form is part of the NPC registration process.

NPC Selection Standards

The APC recognizes and respects the right of NPCs to establish national selection standards for determining an athlete's or team's qualification to compete in the Asian Para Games. Such standards must be compliant with those established by respective IF's/AF's terms as well as the dates of confirmation and administrative deadlines defined in this Guide. All athletes and teams are equally subject to their respective NPC selection standards when applied.

Classification Eligibility Regulations (Sport Class Status)

Only qualified athletes that meet the sport-specific classification eligibility requirements will be eligible for entry in the Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Asian Para Games. It is the responsibility of each NPC to ensure that its athletes hold a sport class status that complies with the sport's eligibility requirements as published in this Guide.

Athletes with the following Sport Class Status are eligible to participate in the specific sport at the Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Asian Para Games.

- N = New
- R = Review
- FRD = Fixed Review Date
- CNC = Classification Not Complete or
- C = Confirmed

Athletes with 'New(N)', 'Review(R)', 'Fixed Review Date (FRD) of 2026 or before' or 'Classification Not Complete (CNC)' sport class status must undergo international classification on site. Athletes will need to present themselves for classification at the date and time designated by the sport. NPCs must present all relevant medical paperwork for their athletes with 'N', 'R', 'FRD' or 'CNC' status to the respective IF/AF, according to their classification rules. Please note that some sports will not offer international classification at the Games. For every classification matter, the NPC must contact the respective IF/AF.

Viability Criteria

Where the IF/AF does not state its Viability Criteria, then it shall adhere to the Viability Criteria of the APC as follows:

- Individual Events: There should be a minimum of FOUR (4) athletes from TWO (2) participating nations.
- Team Events: There should be a minimum of FOUR (4) participating nations.

In exceptional cases where an event is already on the final programme and does not fulfil the Viability Criteria during the competition day, the following alternative steps can be taken:

- Technical Delegate's Decision:

The Technical Delegate reserves the right to amend the original event programme and move the athletes into another class or combine different classes together to ensure event viability and implement the "minus-one rule".

Medal

Gold, silver and bronze medals shall be awarded to the first three place. In exceptional case where only three or fewer athletes compete in a medal event will be awarded following the "minus-one rule". For example, if an event is finalised by 2 athletes/teams only, only gold medal will be allocated.

Bipartite Invitations

While the primary method in which the Asian Para Games guiding principles are respected is through the standard qualification methods, the APC and IFs/AFs have also sought to provide targeted qualification slot allocations in particular sports through the Bipartite Commission Invitation Allocation Method. These invitations are included in the overall athlete quotas of the relevant sports. Invitations are granted on a discretionary basis by the APC and the respective IF/AF and are typically allocated based on the following principles:

- To ensure participation of top athletes who may not have had the opportunity to formally qualify through other methods due to extraordinary circumstances.
- To ensure the representation of athletes with a high support need.
- To ensure medal events will have sufficient representation for viability.
- To enable greater representation by gender.

Timelines and Application Procedures

Each sport offering Bipartite Invitation slots has established its individual timeline for submission and acceptance of Bipartite Applications. Please refer to the respective section in each sport's chapter of this Guide.

Redistribution of Unused Qualifications Slots

Qualification slots that are not allocated or reallocated by their sports by the established deadlines or go unused (following the deadline for final entries) may be redistributed at the sole discretion of the APC and IFs to any sport on the program.



KEY DATES

The following dates and deadlines established by the APC and the AINAGOC are required to be observed across all sports on the programme.

Each IF/AF may determine their own qualification period during which athletes and teams can attain results and rankings that count towards qualification for the Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Asian Para Games. All qualifying results must be achieved during the respective sport's qualification period. Results and rankings achieved prior to the sport-specific qualification period may not be considered for qualification towards the Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Asian Para Games. Participation in a competition during the qualification period may depend on results achieved prior to the beginning of the respective sport's qualification period.

10 October 2025

NPC Entry by Number deadline: This is the deadline for NPCs to submit total number of athletes to AINAPCOG in accordance with the sport entries policy.

31 July 2026

NPC Entry by Name deadline: This is the deadline for NPCs to submit to AINAGOC all confirmation of sports entries by name in accordance with the sport entries policy.

ALLOCATION OF QUALIFICATION SLOTS

The qualification slot is allocated to the NPC not to an individual athlete or team.

Two (2) quotas per each category will be guaranteed to the Host Country.

MAXIMUM QUOTA ALLOCATION PER NPC

An NPC may be allocated a maximum of two (2) slots per individual medal event for a maximum of six (6) male slots and six (6) female slots.

ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for selection by an NPC, athletes must:

- Have a classification status – ‘New’, ‘Review’ or ‘Confirmed’
- Have achieved one (1) of the following Minimum Qualification Standards (MQS) for their respective sport class at the World Ranking Event (WRE) between 30 March 2025 and 9 April 2026.

MAXIMUM ENTRY PER NPC

An NPC can enter a maximum of two (2) athletes per individual event, but not more than it has been allocated qualification slots in each individual medal events. An NPC automatically enters a maximum of one (1) team comprised of one (1) eligible male and one (1) eligible female athlete if they have athletes competing in both genders. Team members are selected from the athletes who compete in the individual events. In principle the highest ranked male athlete and the highest ranked female athlete will be considered as the team, but the team composition can be modified after the ranking round.

Each qualification slots will be awarded based on the World Archery world ranking as of 2 July 2026. An athlete can only obtain one (1) qualification slot for their NPC.

CONFIRMATION PROCESS OF ALLOCATED SLOTS

By 27 April 2026, each NPC must confirm to World Archery Asia in writing the number of qualification slots they will use. NPCs that have not replied by this date will have lost their slots and World Archery Asia may reallocate them.

By 10 May 2026, World Archery Asia will confirm in writing the reallocation of all unused qualification slots.

By 15 May 2026, it is officially declared that the respective NPCs will use the allocated slots for the Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Asian Para Games. Any NPC that does not use its allocated slots may be subject to sanctions by APC and World Archery Asia

ALLOCATION OF QUALIFICATION SLOTS

The qualification slot is allocated to the NPC not to the individual athlete. In the case of a Bipartite Commission Invitation the slot is allocated to the individual athlete not to the NPC.

If more athletes have achieved a MES than the total number of qualification slots available under this method, then the qualification slots will be allocated as follows:

Male Allocation*: $A \times (B \div C)$

Female Allocation*: $A \times (B \div C)$

A – Number of athletes with a MES per gender per NPC

B – Total number of available qualification slots per gender

C – Total number of athletes with a MES per gender for all NPCs

*in order to achieve the required allocation of qualification slots per gender the rounding up or down of data may be necessary.

In the case more qualification slots are available in a gender than the number of eligible athletes who have achieved an MES, the remaining slots will be allocated via the Bipartite Commission Invitation method.

MAXIMUM QUOTA ALLOCATION PER NPC

An NPC can enter a maximum of sixty (60) eligible athletes across all medal events. Exceptions may be granted through the Bipartite Commission Invitation Allocation method.

If an NPC is unable to use all of the allocated qualification slots, such unused slots will be returned to APC and may be reallocated by APC to other NPCs through: (i) the same allocation method the unused slots were originally allocated in; or (ii) the Bipartite Commission Invitation Allocation method.

ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for entry, an athlete must:

- hold an active WPA Athlete Licence for the 2026 season;
- have achieved a Minimum Entry Standard (MES) at a World Para Athletics Recognised Competition for at least one event from the published event programme between 01 January 2025 and 31 July 2026 in accordance with the IPC Athlete Licensing Programme Policies valid for the 2025-2026 seasons; or
- have been allocated a Bipartite Commission Invitation slot.

To be eligible for a relay event, an athlete must:

- be entered into an individual medal event.

Athletes with International 'New', 'Review' and 'Confirmed' sport class status are allowed to enter.

BIPARTITE COMMISSION INVITATIONS

The slots, equally distributed between male and female athletes, will be available for consideration by APC and World Para Athletics for Bipartite Commission Invitation qualification slots.

To be considered for a Bipartite Commission Invitation, an athlete must hold an IPC Athlete Licence for the 2026 season. NPC must submit an official application in writing to APC by 15 June 2026.

The Bipartite Commission Invitation slot is allocated to the individual athlete and is not transferable to another athlete.

MAXIMUM ENTRY PER NPC

An NPC may enter a maximum of three (3) eligible athletes per single class medal event. An NPC may enter a maximum of five (5) eligible athletes in medal events where two (2) or more sport classes are clustered (e.g., Discus Throw F54/55/56). However, per each sport class, a maximum of three (3) eligible athletes can be entered.

An NPC may enter a maximum of one (1) team in the relay event provided that the team is comprised of athletes already entered into an individual event and the composition of the team meets the relevant World Para Athletics Competition Rules. No Minimum Entry Standard is required for the relay. NPCs may enter an eligible athlete in an unlimited number of events as long as the athlete has met a MES in at least one of the events for which the athlete is to be entered.

EVENT VIABILITY CRITERIA

A minimum of four (4) athlete entries from two (2) NPCs is necessary to sustain an individual medal event on the programme. A minimum of four (4) entries from four (4) NPCs is necessary to sustain a relay medal event on the programme.

World Para Athletics shall review the event viability following the close of the final entry on 31 July 2026. In the case an event did not meet the above viability criteria by the final entry, World Para Athletics may combine such event with other event(s) where appropriate and applicable. In such combined field events, the Raza point system may be used to determine the placings. World Para Athletics also reserve the right to cancel such events or run them as non-medal events.

In the case the entry number of an event dropped below the aforementioned event viability criteria due to withdrawals after 31 July 2026, the event shall still be run as a Medal Event, and the medals will be allocated under the “minus one” principle as follows: three entries only gold and silver; two entries only gold.

World Boccia have up to **50** Bipartite Commission Invitation slots to allocate equally across males and females. In the case where fewer applications are received for either gender or they are incomplete, World Boccia may allocate slots across the opposite gender.

ALLOCATION OF QUALIFICATION SLOTS

A slot allocation procedure might be needed following the Entry by Number if necessary.

It will be under the discretion of Asian Paralympic committee, in consultation with the World Para Swimming, to distribute any slots remaining after the entry deadline.

ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for selection by an NPC, athletes must:

1. Hold an active World Para Swimming Athletes License for the 2026 season
2. Have achieved a Minimum Qualification Standard (MQS) at a World Para Swimming approved 50m competition for the event on the program between 01 January 2025 and 30 June 2026 (times are only recognised if the athlete was already licensed at the time of the achievement or has a recognised split time World/Regional record in the same length & stroke, that is included in the rankings).
3. Have achieved a Minimum Qualification Standard (MQS) in accordance with the Athlete Licensing Program Policies valid for the 2025-2026 seasons
4. be classified with a “Confirmed” (C) or “Fixed Date Review” 2027 or later (FDR)*
5. one relay specific athlete (without MQS) can be added to the NPC Team (no participation in other events is allowed in this case) – please contact the Local organising committee or Asian Paralympic Committee. There can be a different relay-specific athlete entered for the different relays on the final programme.

*In relation to criterion 4 above, NPCs are permitted to provisionally select athletes with a Sport Class Status of (i) Review; (ii) Review with a Fixed Review Date of 2026 or earlier; (iii) New, subject to such athletes fulfilling the other qualification requirements above and attending an Evaluation Session prior to or during the Games (including any required in-competition Observation Assessment).

Note:

The MQS was set on 16th place of the official Asian ranking list 01 01 2023- 31 December 2024. If there were not 16 athletes, the average of the last two times of the rankings is used as an MQS. If there were five or less athletes in the rankings, rank 25 of the official World ranking lists was used (where appropriate). If there are less than 25 athletes in the official World ranking the average of the last two times is used as an MQS

For relay events there are no MQS times, teams can be entered even without previous achievement (they will be seeded with 'no time'). NPCs that have time for their relay team from the qualification period can enter this result in the final entries.

BIPARTITE COMMISSION INVITATIONS

All Bipartite Commission Invitation slots are at the sole discretion of World Para Swimming and APC, and there is no obligation to award any slots, regardless of whether or not the athlete meets the criteria above. The number of allocated slots must not exceed the total Athlete Quota for Para Swimming.

The Bipartite Commission Invitation slot is allocated to the individual athlete and is not transferable to another athlete.

To be considered for a Bipartite Commission Invitation, an athlete must meet Criteria 1 and 4 of the Athlete Eligibility.

World Para Swimming must receive an official application from the relevant NPC to nicole.burns@worldparaswimming.org and be entered into the WPS SDMS System-Bipartite Request <https://www.ipc-services.org/sdms> no later than 07 07 2026.

All Bipartite Commission Invitation slots are considered under the following criteria:

- To enable the greater representation by a nation.
- To ensure events featured on the programme have sufficient representation for viability.
- To enable greater representation by gender.
- To ensure the further representation of athletes with high support needs.

- To ensure top athletes that may have not had the opportunity to formally qualify due to extraordinary circumstances.
- To ensure new athletes that may have not had the opportunity to be formally classified due to extraordinary circumstances.

Competition Format

The Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Asian Para Games will be conducted by the Single Class competition format. Events that will not meet the Event Viability Criteria outlined below after the Entry by Name will be combined with the nearest single class event and will be included in the Final Event Programme. For those combined events, the athletes must achieve the MQS times for their respective classes and medals will be awarded for each single class.

MAXIMUM ENTRY PER NPC

NPCs can enter a maximum of three (3) eligible swimmers per medal event if all have met the MQS. However, only a maximum of three (3) swimmers per each eligible sport class can be entered if all met the MQS.

NPCs can enter 1 Relay Teams per relay event.

EVENT VIABILITY CRITERIA

Individual events will be considered viable if they have a minimum of Five (5) eligible swimmers from three (3) NPCs entered through the Entry by Name. For classes S11, four (4) eligible athletes from two (2) NPCs through Entry by Name are required.

Relay events will be considered viable if they have a minimum of four (4) eligible NPCs entered through the Entry by Name.

Asian Paralympic Committee in consultation with World Para Swimming shall review the event viability following the close of the final entry on 31 07 2026. In the case an event does not meet the above viability criteria by the final entry, Asian Paralympic Committee in consultation with World Para Swimming may combine such event with the nearest single class where appropriate and applicable.

In the case the entry number of an event dropped below the aforementioned event viability criteria due to withdrawals after 31 07 2026, the event shall still be run as a Medal Event.

Medals may be allocated under the 'minus one' rule in accordance with rule 10.14.1 where applicable.

CONFIRMATION PROCESS OF ALLOCATED SLOTS

By **January 30, 2026**, each qualified NPC must confirm to World Para Taekwondo in writing (only email is accepted) if they wish to use their allocated slots from World Ranking List and Host Country Allocation. NPCs that have not responded by this date will lose their qualification slots, and World Para Taekwondo may reallocate these slots.

By **June 30, 2026**, each qualified NPC must confirm to World Para Taekwondo in writing (only email is accepted) if they wish to use their allocated slots from the Qualification Tournament.

By **July 24, 2026**, it is officially declared that the respective NPCs will use the allocated slots for the Aichi-Nagoya 2026 Asian Para Games. Any NPC that does not use its allocated slots may be subject to sanctions by APC and World Para Taekwondo.”

REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUALIFICATION SLOTS

Any qualification slots allocated and not used by the respective NPC will be reallocated via the Bipartite Commission Invitation Allocation method regardless of gender and weight category.

Be a national of the country of the NPC he or she is representing. As per the IPC Athlete Nationality Policy, the appropriate evidence that a competitor is a national of any country will generally be that he or she holds an official passport issued by the respective country.

An NPC can enter a maximum of twelve (12) eligible male athletes for the Men's tournament and a maximum of twelve (12) eligible female for the Women's tournament.

- Have a valid World Para Fencing License for 2026.
- Be eligible within the rules of World Para Fencing Classification Code and provide proof of application for international classification.

MAXIMUM ENTRY PER NPC

The qualification slot is allocated to the individual athlete, not to the NPC.

ATHLETE ELIGIBILITY

All athletes must comply with the General APC Regulations on Eligibility

Unless otherwise specified in this Qualification System, to be eligible for selection by an NPC, athletes must also:

1. have an official ranking on the International Tennis Federation (ITF) Wheelchair Tennis Singles World Ranking List dated 29 June 2026 (exceptions may be granted through the Bipartite Commission Invitation Allocation method); and
2. be internationally classified in an eligible Sport Class with a Sport Class Status of (i) Confirmed; or (ii) Review with a Fixed Review Date of 1 January 2027 or later*; and
3. hold a current ITF IPIN membership; and
4. comply with the eligibility requirements (Eligibility of Players and Captains) set out in the ITF Wheelchair Tennis Competition Regulations in force at the time, such that the 2026 Asian Para Games is considered to be a 'Team Competition' for the purposes of this Regulation only.

*In relation to criterion 2 above, NPCs are permitted to provisionally select athletes with a Sport Class Status of (i) New; (ii) Review; and (iii) Review with a Fixed Review Date of 31 December 2026 or earlier, subject to such athletes attending an Evaluation Session prior to or during the Games (including any required in competition Observation Assessment).

For Bipartite Commission Invitation Allocations, the ITF may consider athletes who do not have an official ranking on the ITF Wheelchair Tennis Singles World Ranking List dated 29 June 2026.

NPCs may only nominate athletes for participation in the 2026 Asian Para Games if their country's National Association is a current ITF member in good standing, and it has been a member since at least 31 December 2025.

The participation of an athlete is conditional upon the athlete meeting the above detailed athlete eligibility criteria (both APC and ITF). For the avoidance of doubt, where either the ITF or APC eligibility criteria impose stricter or additional requirements than the other, the stricter or additional rules shall apply.

MAXIMUM ENTRY PER NATIONAL PARALYMPIC COMMITTEE (NPC)

Singles events

An NPC can enter a maximum of two (2) qualified male athletes and two (2) qualified female athletes in the men's and women's singles events, respectively.

An NPC can enter a maximum of two (2) qualified athletes in the quad singles event.

In the unlikely event that a draw is not filled, the maximum entry per NPC may be exceeded at the discretion of the ITF and the APC.

Doubles events

An NPC can enter a maximum of one (1) eligible men's team and one (1) eligible women's team in the men's and women's doubles events, respectively.

An NPC can enter a maximum of one (1) eligible team in the quad doubles event.

Team members are selected from the athletes participating in their respective singles event. NPCs must submit their doubles nominations in writing to the ITF by (date tbc).

In the unlikely event that a draw is not filled, the maximum entry per NPC may be exceeded at the discretion of the ITF and the APC.

CONFIRMATION PROCESS OF ALLOCATED SLOTS

By 8 July 2026 each qualified NPC must confirm to ITF in writing (signed and scanned email is acceptable) if they wish to use their allocated qualification slots. NPCs that have not responded by this date will lose their qualification slots, and ITF may reallocate these slots.

By 24 July 2026 ITF will confirm in writing the reallocation of all unused qualification slots.

By 24 July 2026 it is officially declared that the respective NPCs will use the allocated slots for the 2026 Asian Para Games. Any NPC that does not use its allocated qualification slots may be subject to sanctions by APC and ITF.



REALLOCATION OF UNUSED QUALIFICATION SLOTS

Any qualification slots that are (a) allocated and not confirmed by the respective NPC by 8 July 2026 or (b) returned as a result of player withdrawal will be reallocated to the next highest ranked eligible athlete from the Asian Region (not otherwise qualified) in the respective event on the ITF Wheelchair Tennis World Singles Ranking List dated 29 June 2026 (subject to the maximum quota per NPC).

Should a Bipartite slot be returned, the Bipartite Commission will select another athlete from a reserve list of Bipartite applicants.

This reallocation process may occur up until 24 July 2026.

An NPC that does not confirm an allocated or reallocated qualification slot will not be eligible to receive another slot in the respective event(s) unless the ITF receives signed confirmation from the athlete that they do not wish to take up their qualification slot.

SANCTION

The Wheelchair Tennis Event of the 2026 Asian Para Games is sanctioned by the ITF. ITF Wheelchair Tennis World Ranking Points at WT175 Level (TBC) will be awarded.
